Call up your local police station and record the conversation as evidence as you ask the following questions:

- 1. Who am I speaking with?
- 2. What is your position here?
- 3. Is this police station publicly or privately owned?
- 4. Being that this station is a public building would that not make you a public servant?
- 5. A public servant is required to swear an oath of office that they must be able to recite upon request to hold the authority granted them by the people? To the best of your knowledge is that correct?
- 6. Can you explain to me how you define the universal principles of morality?
- 7. Do you agree that a public servant must pledge an oath that binds them to make decisions and take actions that fall within the confines of universal morality?
- 8. Have you taken the oath to stand under the universal principles of morality?
- 9. To verify that you are indeed operating under the authority of people I require you to recite your oath of public service.
- 10. I require you explain how (name of police in your state) listed as a corporation registered for GST with an ABN (quote ABN number) on the Australian Business Registry, and listed on Dun & Bradstreet, a credit reporting agency for corporations, is acting morally to serve the people?
- 11. Can you explain how police recruited and trained in government operated academies, can protect and serve the people from a dangerous and corrupt state power, given the police are directly answerable to government, and not the people?
